Two years running, The Awaken Project has been a valuable addition to Quake. Quake is a hotel-based weekend conference for Christian youth groups. The Awaken Project has added vibrant energy as these young adults serve as technical support, program leaders, and role-models.

The Awaken Project does a lot of behind-the-scenes jobs that keep Quake flowing smoothly. Because this same set of young adults serve at so many Quake events around the country, they become skilled at technical tasks including setup and tear down of the entire concert venue-including audio, lighting, and media. One of them is often the lighting engineer for large-group worship. The Awaken Project leads a food packaging service project, workshops as needed, and orientation for up to 500 youth.

What sets Quake apart from other youth conferences is the intentionality of the staff to authentically invest in youth, making space for the Holy Spirit to move. The Awaken Project's biggest asset is their willingness to join youth groups for devotions, meals, and hanging out with groups between scheduled programming.
